## YAKIMA FESTIVAL AND SEASIDE FLY-IN

The organizers had lots of vendors selling every thing from hot pot holders to kites along with food and soft-drinks.

Sunday was different. Creda Axton was up with the birds (5:30) camera in hand, off to watch the hot air balloons. But too much wind kept them from launching. Creda returned to the motor home to catch a few more zzzzzzz's.

The people on the East side were introduced to Trlbys as later in the day Al Axton put up 55 Trlbys and flew them until he broke his 500# test line allowing them to float across a tennis court, road and almost clearing a barb-wire fence. All were saved a little worse for wear. We rolled them up and stuffed them into Al's motor home, giving him something to do during the next week. Sonny Kersh demonstrated the correct way to be dragged across a field by 27 Trlbys; it sure is different flying on grass when you are used to sand.

Sunday's great winds saved the 1st Yakima Kite Fest. A grand time was had by all who made the trip.

The Seaside Fly-In was another good showing by the Windriders. This is a fun place with lots to do within walking distance of the beach.

Both days had a fair wind and

everyone was able to fly. Saturday night with all the hotels having flood lights to light the beach we were able to fly long after dark.

## KITER KWIZEEN

This issue's recipe is submitted by Paul Durant of Calgary, AB.

### RED BEANS & RICE

2 - 14 oz Tins Red Kidney Beans  
 3 - Cups Water  
 1 1/2 - Cups Long Grain Rice  
 2 - Stalks Celery - Chopped  
 1 - Green Pepper - Chopped  
 2 - Clove Garlic - Minced  
 1 - Large Bay Leaf - Crushed  
 1 - Large Onion - Chopped  
 1 - Tbs Parsley - Chopped  
 2 - Tbs Veg. Oil  
 Lea & Perrins Worcestershire Sauce  
 Louisiana Hot Pepper Sauce

Saute onion & garlic in veg oil till soft, add celery, green pepper & bay leaf, cook for 5 min. Add 2 cans kidney beans, 1 tsp Worcestershire sauce, 1 tsp hot pepper sauce and simmer for 10 minutes. Serve on hot rice, sprinkle with parsley, add Worcestershire & pepper sauce to taste. Have cold beer handy.
