This month's recipe was submitted by Virginia Durant, Calgary

Coconut Loaf

- 1/2 Cup Margerine
- 1 Cup Granulated Sugar
- 2 Eggs
- 1/2 Cup Milk
- 1 tsp Vanila Extract
- 1 1/2 Cup All-purpose Flour
- 1 tsp Baking Powder
- 1/2 tsp Salt
- 1 Cup Fine Grind Coconut

Mix margarine and sugar together till creamy.

Beat in eggs one at a time. Mix in vanilla and milk.

In a small bowl mix flour, baking powder, salt and coconut. Add to above batter and stir till blended.

Place in 9" x 5" x 3" greased loaf pan. Bake at 350 deg. F for 60 to 70 minutes or till toothpick comes out clean.

Cool for ten minutes. Remove to cooling rack. Makes one loaf.

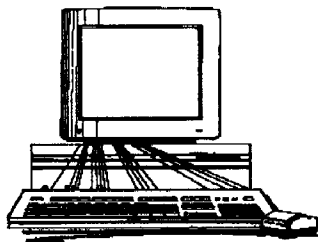
